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IMPORTANT NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

The road book for this event has been created based on providing instructions that enable crews to traverse the course.

It has been carefully prepared, and independently checked, using non- competitive vehicles at relatively low speeds.

The instructions are our interpretation of the course. They may not contain some items that you consider to be hazards, and they may not contain items that become a hazard.

The instructions cannot, and must not, be used as any form of “pace notes”. This event is a “blind event” and competitors should drive to what they can see.

The special stages and liaisons traverse a wide range of public and private roads. Animals, both wild and domestic, may be found on the course during the event. In addition, the course may contain changes in direction, and/or surface, which may not be in the instructions.

Accordingly, we advise crews that they are totally responsible for the manner and speed in which they traverse the course, and ultimately their own safety. Crews should be taking their own experience and abilities into account, and so traverse the course in the manner and speed at which they are comfortable.

Remember – motor sport is dangerous - Drive according to what you can see.

Australia's newest event for Classic Cars A Round of the MRF South Australian Rally Championship A Round of the East Coast Classic Rally Series (2WD/4WD)

We are pleased that the Shannons Rally Heartland will return in 2024.

It will be a competitive event of 520 kilometres based in the Hallett/Burra/Terowie/Robertstown area, and one that will be a bit "different" to what has gone before.

It is planned for the **26th, 27th and 28th April 2024**, and the competition will run on the Friday, Friday night, Saturday, Saturday night and Sunday. Friday will see the use of several prologue stages.

The Event will be open to Classic Rally Cars (C1-C4) and other Rally Cars accepted as being suitable for the Event by the Organisers. We want to make it as easy as possible to enter and process the requirements of scrutineering and documentation

Quick Summary:

- ✚ Naming rights sponsor is Shannons Insurance and Platform Sponsor is Lazer Lamps.
- ✚ Long night stages in full darkness, full fee entrants only
- ✚ Easy liaisons.
- ✚ Service Park is in Burra at Paxton Square and Burra Community School.
- ✚ Minimum time away from home, but over 500 competitive kms in total.
- ✚ No local testing, no recce. This is a "blind" event. It is a road book only rally.
- ✚ Regional Scrutiny is allowed/encouraged across the board, spot checks during the event
- ✚ RallySafe is mandatory for all cars
- ✚ Five MIVs will be in attendance, covering all stages accordingly
- ✚ parc fermé for the SARC competitors only
- ✚ Entries limited to 75 – a starting spot can be reserved by a payment of \$300 Inc. Tax, which would be deducted from the entry fee, and is not refundable.
- ✚ There is an invitational and a regularity category, and opportunity to compete in various sections of the event only
- ✚ New award is a Senior and Junior plate
- ✚ Road Book will be offered electronically

There is a wide range of accommodation available in the region including Paxton Square cottages (step out of your room into your service area!), Paxton Square Caravan Park, Hotel accommodation in Burra as well as lots of guest houses in the area. 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Service Park

General Information

Service will be mostly at Paxton Square and Burra Community School – in and around the heritage cottages.

The service park will open at 1200 hours on Thursday April 25th and close at 2030 hours on Sunday April 28th

There is no option for setup any earlier.

The service Park Manager is Beth Baillie 0452 462 011, and she will allocate space. If you are a returning competitor and would like the same space, let Beth know ASAP.

Speed limit in Service Parks

The speed limit is 5kph – walking pace – in and around the area. It will be strictly enforced, and reports made to Stewards if necessary – and then a penalty may apply.

Service Park Controls

Time controls will be set up at the entry and exit to all service parks. The time allowed for service will be indicated in the road book. Liaisons to and from Service Park do not form part of the service time provided.

Section times have been made long enough to not require the need for ANY speeding.

Car Washing

At Service Park

The use of pressure cleaners is prohibited in the Service Park. Cars may only be washed by use of a sponge from a bucket. Where oils, solvents and degreasing fluids are used all residues must be securely contained, removed from the Service Park and not be allowed to come in contact with the ground. Breaches noted by an official of the rally will result in a report to the Stewards with a recommendation that a fine be applied.

This does not apply to any washing facilities supplied by the organisers.

Facilities

Toilets and rubbish disposal will be available within the Service Park including skips specifically for hard rubbish.

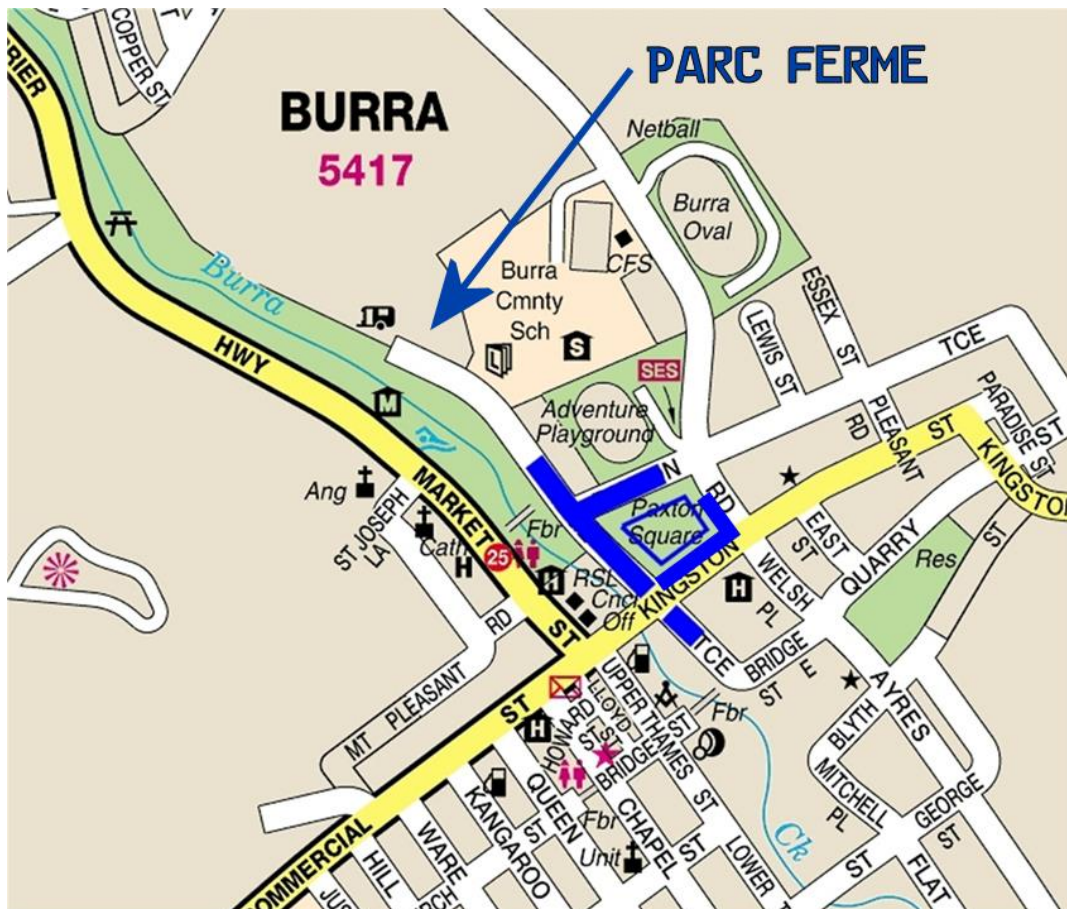

Basic Life Support Chart

D ANGER	Assess your surroundings for potential dangers and get to a safe place, if necessary	
R ESPONSE	Check if the person can respond to you. Ask their name, gentle shake their shoulder. If not responding, move to next step	
S END HELP	Call 000 or ask someone else to. Follow instructions/questions of the operator	
A IRWAY	Open airway, look for any obstructions, maintain neutral head position	
B REATHING	Look, listen and feel for breathing. If not breathing, begin CPR	
C PR	Begin CPR by applying 30 chest compressions, followed by two breaths into the patient's mouth	
D EFIBRILLATOR	Use a Defibrillator and follow the prompts	

Safety and First Aid Tips

Most medical problems that arise with such events can be relieved by simple, effective management.

Strains and Sprains

- Sit down in a safe and dry location
- Rest the injured limb
- Ice (wrapped in a wet towel) should be applied for 15 – 20 minutes
- Compression / bandage should also be applied for support
- Elevate the injured limb
- Refer to Medical advice if pain continues or loss of movement is experienced

Minor Lacerations / Abrasions

- Sit down in a safe and dry location
- Inspect the injured site
- Brush any surface items off, i.e. dirt, pine needles etc
- Irrigate the injured site with water
- Leave any embedded items intact in the wound (Support the embedded item and seek medical aid immediately)
- Cover / dress the injured site and assess in 24 hours. Seek Medical advice if uncertain

Burns

- Sit down in a safe and dry location
- Immediately cool the burn site by flooding with water
- Remove excess clothing at the burn site, but DO NOT pull burnt skin / clothing apart
- If the burn is the size of the patients palm or is to the face or neck, then contact Medical assistance immediately.
- For all other burns, continue cooling, being careful not to overcool the patient
- Cover / dress the burnt site and assess in 24 hours. Seek Medical advice if uncertain

Snake Bites

- Assume all snake bites are poisonous and always believe someone when they say they have been bitten by a snake, even though you may not see any puncture marks.
- Management of a snakebite – Pressure immobilisation method:
 1. Rest the casualty.
 2. Don't panic.
 3. Apply direct pressure over the bitten area.
 4. Apply a firm bandage over the bite area first, then bandage down the limb and continue to bandage up the full length of the limb.
 5. Immobilise the limb with a splint and call for medical aid.
- REMEMBER – Do not wash the bitten area. Do not remove the bandage. Do not elevate the limb. Do not walk or run – get help to you.

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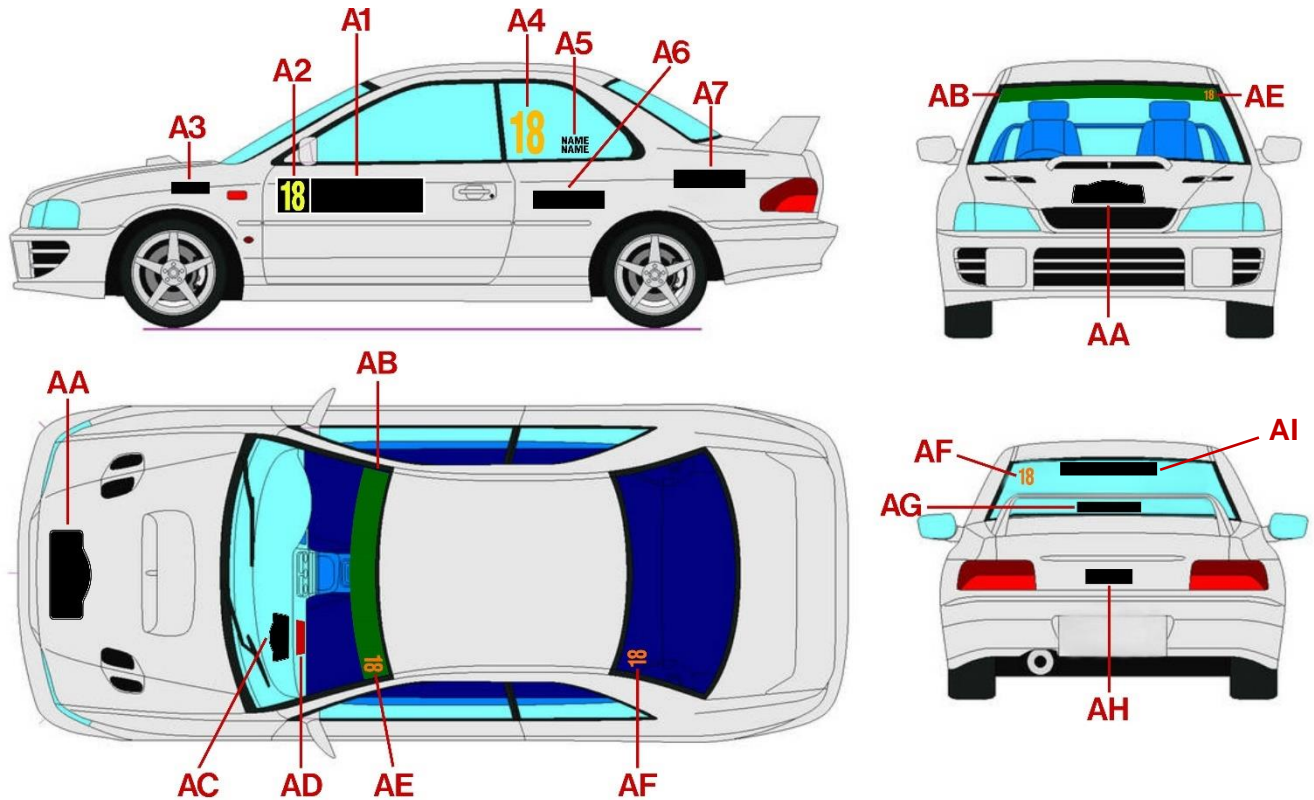

RallySafe – Satellite Timing

Timing by satellite using the RallySafe technology and equipment has been employed by Rally SA for many events now, and satellite timing will again be used for all time controls, not just for special stages.

Time cards will be provided for competitor use only to maintain their own record.

The process for competitors is as follows:

- a) Competition Vehicles arrive at Time Control (TC)
- b) Vehicle is checked in at time control by official via the Race Commander Tablet
- c) Vehicle moves to Stage Start (SS)
- d) Competitor's RallySafe unit receives Start time via the Race Commander Tablet
- e) Competitor prepares for Start time and proceeds into stage once the allocated time has come.
- f) Remember NO WHEELSPIN!!
- g) Competitor makes way through stage until Flying Finish (FF)
- h) Once Competitor passes flying finish, the clock is stopped, and time is sent to rally officials.
- i) Stage time displays on RallySafe unit after completing a stage by crossing the Flying Finish. The stage time is no longer displayed on the RallySafe unit after the crew leave the Stop Point, but can still be viewed along with other stage times using the Options button and View Times option.
- j) Competitor then reaches the "SLOW DOWN" signs, where the competitor is required to slow to 10 KM/H and then STOP at the Stop Control.
- k) Officials record car details
- l) Competitor then follows civil road laws to next Time control and/or Stage start.

Dos and Don'ts

SOME DO'S AND DONT'S TO OBSERVE

Do

- Be unfailingly pleasant.
- Show COURTESY to the "Locals" in the areas through which we pass – after all, they live there and we want to come back in future years.
- Report any INCIDENT or ACCIDENT with another vehicle or property. Use the appropriate accident and injury report forms along with the Withdrawal form in your Road Book or get one from Rally Headquarters or one of the CRO's.
- Obey INSTRUCTIONS of all officials – this will make for a smoother event.
- Respect the traffic laws on PUBLIC ROADS. Speed cameras are used in the state of South Australia. If a competitor is reported by the SA Police as having exceeded the speed limit on any transport stage or during recce, that competitor is liable to incur the normal civil road penalties as well as event penalties applied under the Supplementary Regulations.
- Show COURTESY TO OTHER ROAD USERS – you don't know who they are, but in view of the markings on your car they will certainly know who you are.
- Use the CROs (Competitor Relations Officers) for help with any problems.
- Use CONCRETE or WATER CONTAINER WEIGHTS to hold down any shelters or tentage

Don't

- LITTER – there are heavy fines for littering in a public place, so carry a litterbag in your vehicle
- DROP OIL anywhere. The Service Park, overnight and Parc Ferme areas are in private facilities. Please pay attention to mechanicals, which drip oil. Use appropriate measures to deal with oil spills.
- DRINK and DRIVE! It is strictly forbidden to consume intoxicating liquor or to use prohibited drugs during the course of the days of competition or within six hours of a competitor's start time for a day and penalties up to exclusion apply (refer to the Supplementary Regulations).

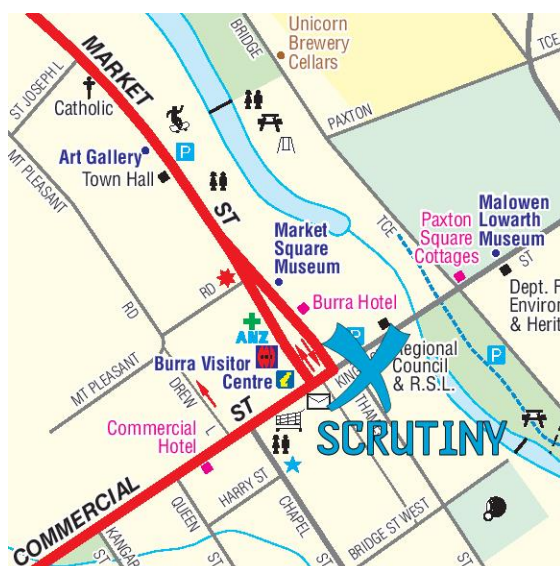

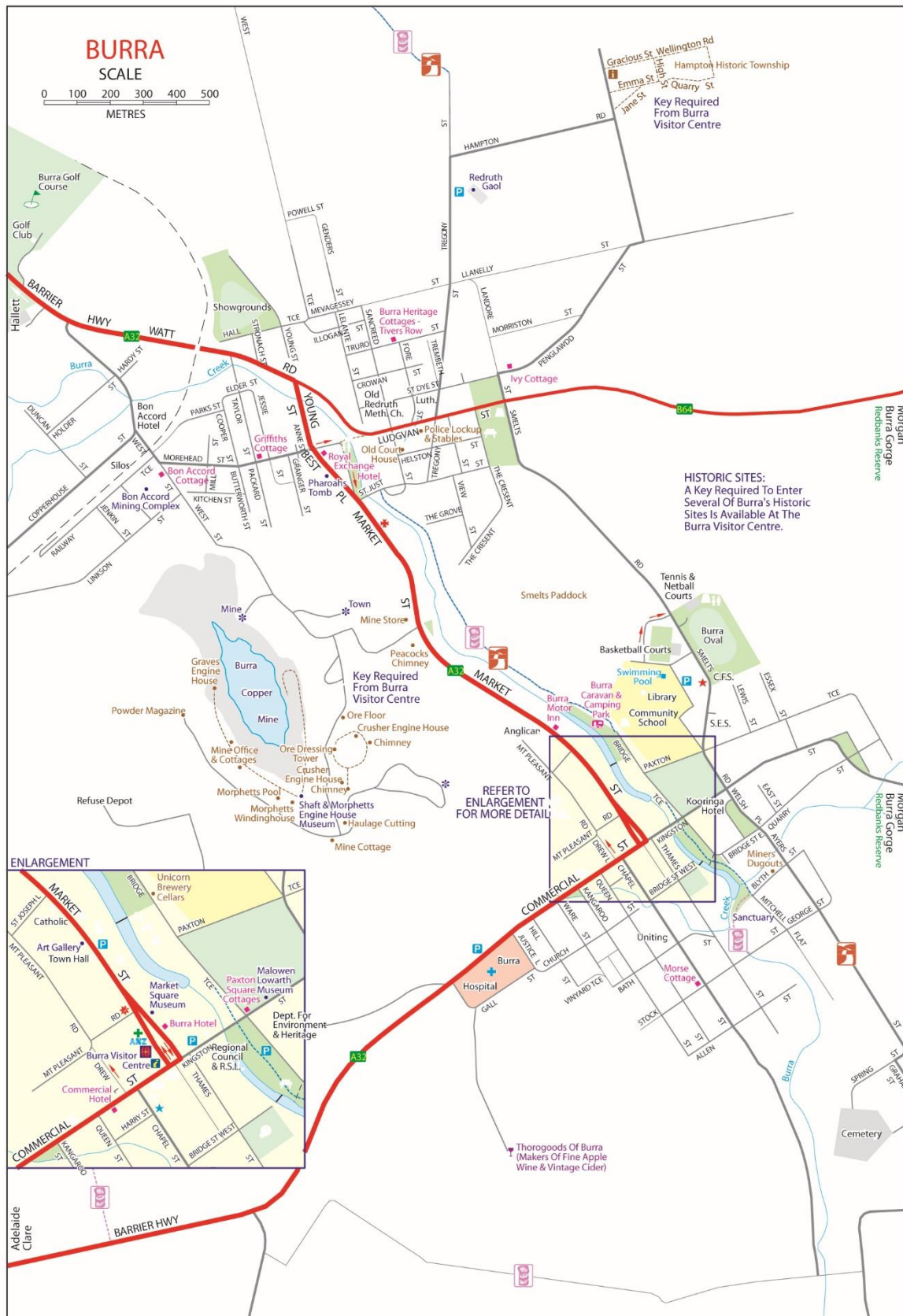

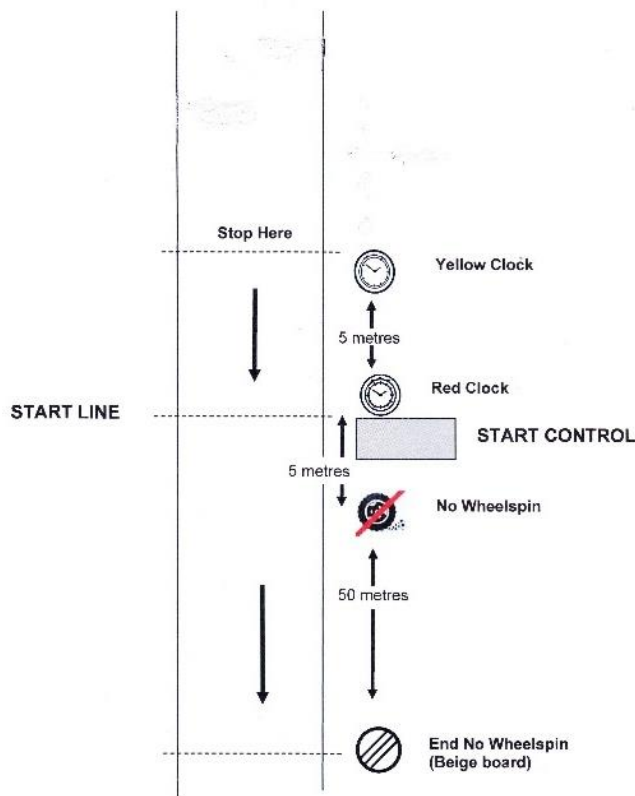
Appendix D – Wheelspin

To improve our reputation with the local community, we have introduced a no wheelspin policy at stage starts and the Burra Community School Service Park. Details below.

Start Control Setup incorporating No Wheelspin Zone

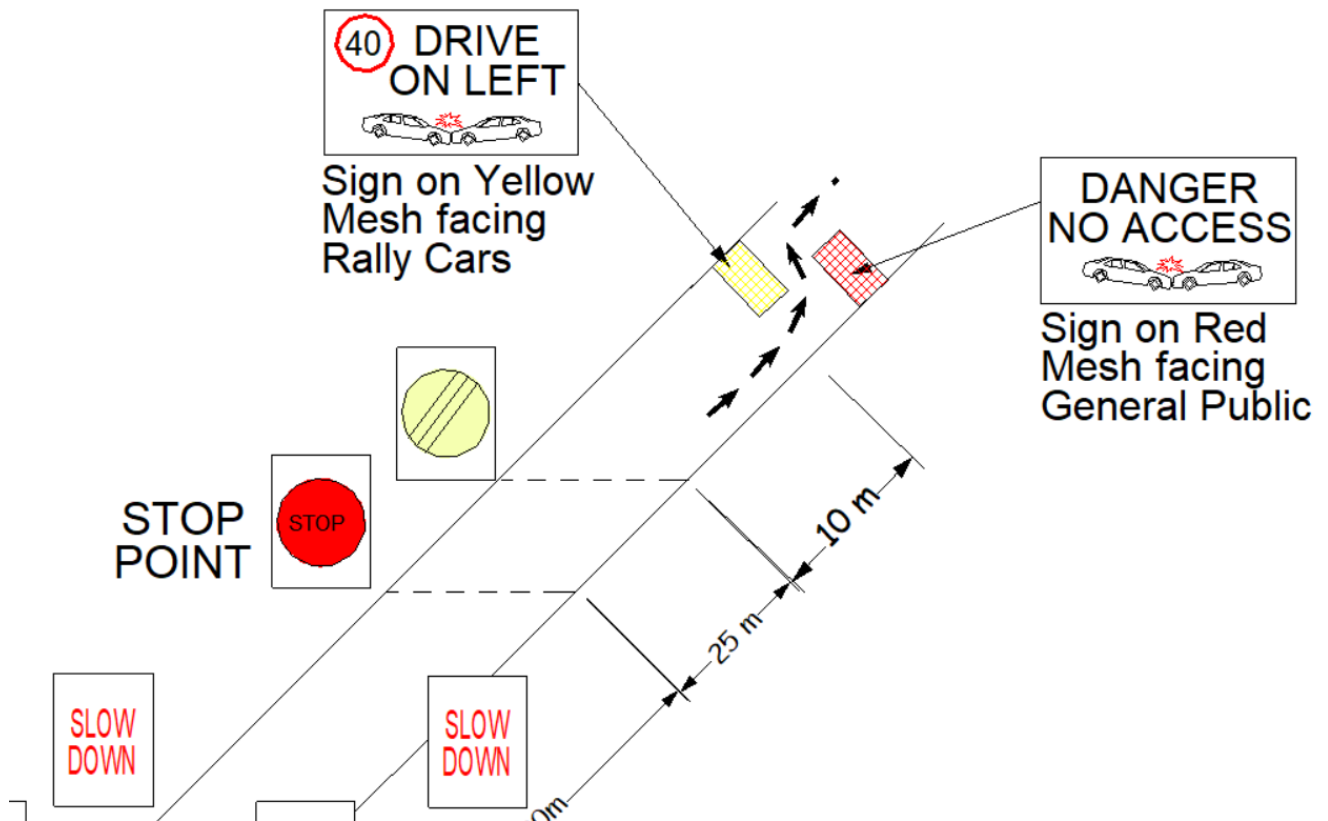
A wheel spin start will be defined as “A sustained loss of traction through wheel spin of any driven wheel with no attempt by the driver to curtail that spinning within the area bounded by the starting position and the End of Control Zone sign”.

Momentary wheel slip on the initial bite from acceleration is acceptable.

Any Control Official shall be a Judge of Fact. Penalties for wheel spin breaches at the start of Competitive Stages shall be as follows:

First offence	Warning - to be communicated to the competitor prior to their start of the next competitive stage. Failing that, prior to their start of the subsequent competitive stage.
Second Offence (after the competitor has received the warning for the first offence)	1-minute penalty
Third and subsequent offences	3-minute penalty per offence and a report to the Stewards

I have heard about the RALLY BOX. What is it?	The competitor Rally Box contains the event pack – everything you need like stickers, maps, road books, caps, tickets etc. Accordingly, everyone can come to Burra all stickered up ready to rally
How do I get my RALLY BOX?	The competitor Rally Boxes will be posted to each entrant's nominated address after close of entries. Entrants must nominate an address where someone is present to sign for the Rally Box – a work address is ideal for security of delivery reasons.
Do I have to put on all the stickers??	Usually, yes. If there is a clash of sponsor, or a desire to retain classic livery, only the stickers nominated as MANDATORY may be used. Dropping stickers attracts a fee of \$150.00, payable with entry
Is the event a round of the SA Rally Championship and SA Regularity Series?	Yes, it is – and all bona fide SARC entrants will be accepted regardless of any entry number limit, providing all payment has been made and entry form completed.
Is the event a round of the East Coast Classic Rally 2WD & 4WD Series?	Yes, it is – and all bona fide ECCRS entrants will be accepted regardless of any entry number limits, providing all payment has been made and entry form completed
Can I get my \$300.00 nomination fee back?	No, the nomination fee is non-refundable.

When do I have to submit my documentation?	You must lodge all your documents with Documents Secretary Geraldine Hough 0431 306 015 geraldine.hough@bigpond.com by 1100hrs on Friday 26 April. You will NOT be permitted to start the rally, and no refund will be made if your documents are incomplete.
Is there an official Rally Guide for this event?	Yes, and it is a MUST read – there is lots of stuff you need to know.
Is the Rally Guide updated regularly?	Yes, check the website for the latest updated version which will be numbered and dated, with additions/changes noted in green
Can I get a refund if I withdraw before entries close?	An entry that is withdrawn at any time prior to Wednesday 3rd April at 1800 hours (close of Entries) will be entitled to a refund of 100%, less the \$300 nomination fee.

I have heard that REGULARITY is being run again. What is it?	Combining speed with strategy, the Regularity category is a timed, competitive category. Cars must aim for an elapsed time relating to an average speed nominated by the organisers. Participants will take part in all daylight stages of the rally on Saturday, and Sunday.
How will the field be seeded?	The entire field will be seeded by the organisers as one group to start on the Friday and reassessed via prologue(s) on the Friday afternoon for the subsequent restart. This seeding will be carried out by the organisers based on resources available to them. Notwithstanding this, Regularity competitors will start at the rear of the field

Will there be a prologue?	Yes, it is planned to run at least THREE prologues on the Friday to validate the starting order Any prologue will count towards the results
What happens if I am caught on, or with any form of Recce?	You will be referred to the event officials and may be excluded from the rally. No refund will be made.
What happens if I am caught with any form of pace notes in the car?	You should start the event without any written notes in your road book. If notes are made on the first pass of any stage, of course that is ok to refer to them on subsequent passes. Start clean, drive to what you can see. Refer to the Event Supplementary Regulations, page 12, item 2.6.1 Don't risk it - You could be referred to the event officials and may be excluded from the rally. No refund will be made.

Are Trucks allowed in the Service Park?	A minimum number of trucks can be catered for. Unless previously arranged and approved, servicing is to be via light vehicles only – Ute or Van. DO NOT ASSUME anything , if in doubt, check with Beth
How many people can I bring into the service park as part of my team?	A total of 8 people from your team are allowed. This includes the Driver, Co-Driver, and service crew members. This may change pending circumstances at the time. Don't forget the requirement to provide a volunteer for a road closure
Will there be food at the Service Park?	No – please use the Town traders wherever possible. There will be an arranged breakfast, organised by the Burra Community School. It will be a vital contributor to raising funds. Please be sure to have everyone attend and contribute
Do I need to order my lunch/food?	PLEASE PRE-ARRANGE ALL ORDERS with Burra outlets directly. See Rally Guide for list of options
Will vegetarian or other special food requirements be catered for?	Special dietary, vegan etc. is NOT catered for directly, so you will need to BYO. Notwithstanding that, local outlets may well be able to assist.
Will I have a road card, and will I have to hand it to control officials?	The event will be using RallySafe for all timing and check-ins. 

Are there rules for behaviour at the community School Oval?	<p>Yes – it's a grass surface, so please treat it with respect. 5kph MAX, no wheelspin. NO wheelspin means gentle travel always please</p> <p>Also, secure your pop ups with weights, not any kind of stake into the ground. Treat it like your home</p>

How will the no wheel-spin start be managed for cars with launch control?	These Cars will be carefully monitored, and the start control officials will be provided with advice on how to tell between launch control and wheel-spin.
My car does not have electronic launch control, how am I affected by the no wheel-spin rule?	All our start controls are managed by experienced rally enthusiasts. If it is determined that you used excessive wheel-spin and made no effort to manage it, you will be referred to the clerk of the course and may incur a road penalty.
What do the !, !! and !!! signs mean?	<p>These are placed 100 metres prior to the caution – these are now known as the Pre-warning Board.</p> <p>! - Caution means there's a higher-than-normal probability there could be an incident. It's a "heads-up" noted in the road book only CARE</p> <p>!! - Double Caution means there's a higher-than-normal probability there could be an incident which will cause major damage to you and/or your car. Noted via Road Book and Signage. Reduction of speed is necessary CAUTION</p> <p>!!! - Triple Caution means there's a higher-than-normal probability there could be an incident that will cause major damage or worse to you and your car. Noted via Road Book and Signage. A severe reduction of speed is necessary DANGER</p>
What is the X Board for??	The X board is placed at the double or triple caution. It indicates where you should be taking care.
What is an RSZ? RESTRICTED SPEED ZONE	<p>RSZ stands for Restricted Speed Zone. This is a nominated length of road e.g. 100m, where a specified speed must not be exceeded.</p> <p>If utilised, it will be marked with RSZ START and a posted speed, e.g. 60 as shown below</p> 
Will the awards be available at the end of the rally?	There will be a formal podium at the PAXTON SQUARE CHAPEL
Will there be a post event function?	Yes, there will. An after Party at the PAXTON SQUARE CHAPEL is planned
